He shed His most precious blood for your sins.”

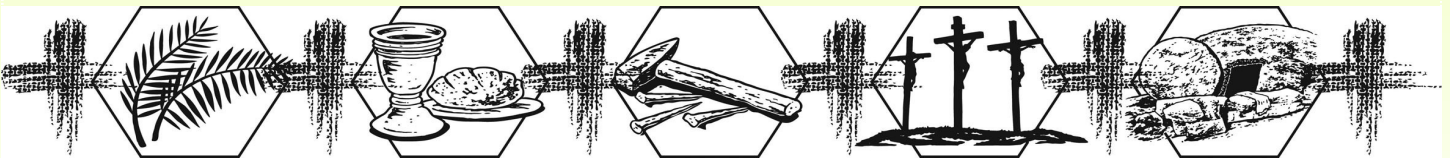

John also brought up the issue of cell phone numbers and email addresses on the church directory. Several members objected to this issue. The missing soffit is to be repaired at \$250.
A volunteer is needed to lead the Men's Club.

New Business

A **MOTION** was passed to approve the current slate of candidates for the Board of Directors.
The "shadowing" of smoke/soot on the sanctuary walls will be covered with Kilz and repainted as a possible solution.
The venting under the soffit on the north and east sides of the sanctuary entrance will be inspected and any issues resolved.
Discussion of reserve/memorial funding for possible projects.

A **MOTION** was passed to approve the landscaping of the parking lot median at a cost of \$4500.
An electronic sign at a cost of about \$40,000 is being investigated by a committee.
Additional chairs and possibly tables are needed in the Fellowship Hall. A committee of volunteers is needed to research this issue.

A **MOTION** was passed to adjourn the meeting. The Lord's Prayer was said in closing.

"Tradition vs. Culture"

I remember growing up, my parents taught me a way of life that was passed down from their parents and what their parents knew was passed down from their parents and so on. My parents taught me a life that kept pointing me back to the traditions of my ancestor. The way Hmong people live is to look backwards to the traditions passed down from the previous generation. This is paramount to ensure the people, who are still living today, a way to know their roots, how to survive, and the way to the next life.

However, growing up in America, I saw that life is different from a western perspective. We, as Americans, look forward into the future in a linear path; as if the past was just the past that gets us here in the present, but the future is more important. Somehow today, the culture of our society today decides the outcome of the future and not the traditions passed down. If this is true, how should we as Christian live our lives? Should we live our lives where our culture becomes more important than our tradition? Should we not look back to the teachings of the past from our traditions and be looking forward to a future like the rest of society, or should we live our lives looking back to the life, death, and resurrection of Christ?

While you ponder on these few questions, allow me to share with you how looking to the past may matter more than looking forward into the future. I am sure that each and every one of us may have some kind of tradition and culture that has been passed down to us from our parents, our society, community, church, state, or country for our survival. Again it's important to know who we are and where we are going, because without the teachings and experience from the traditions and/or cultures passed down to us from those who lived before us, we will end losing what is most important to us, and that is our identity as God's children and creation. However, we should understand how culture and tradition are two different things.

"Tradition is [and involves] the passing of beliefs or behaviors from one generation to the next generation, whereas culture reflects the characteristics that describe a society at a particular time; and the culture is mostly associated with the art forms" (<http://www.differencebetween.info/difference-between-tradition-and-culture>). Basically tradition is what we believe in and culture is how we live according to what we believe. Culture, on the one hand, may change through time, but tradition, on the other hand, is more permanent as a part of life.

Traditions may change, because it does not conform to a culture of a people at one particular time. Cultures change because technology changes and also people no longer hold value to traditions. Eventually something will start off as part of a culture and as time goes on, if it is repeated often enough it becomes part of tradition, e.g. the Easter bunny, Easter egg hunting, and Santa. It has become a tradition to many who do not know the tradition behind Christmas and Easter or yet even the story behind Santa, the Easter bunny and Easter egg hunting. The correct way would be to have tradition shape our culture and not our culture shape our tradition.

Our linear way of thinking as a nation, which values the culture of today more than the tradition of the Church in the life of Christ and the tradition of our forefathers who built this country on Christian values, will become our great downfall; a sexually immoral and adulteress culture. We will fall just like the many great nations that had turned away from God.

This April, we are reminded by the tradition of the Church to look back at what has been passed down by Christ and his apostles to the Church, as we celebrate Easter. Christ's death on the cross on Good Friday and his resurrection on Easter points us to the hope for all mankind when God forgave the sins of the world and granted to all those who believe in his son to be resurrected on the last day and have eternal life with him. Without this tradition of the Church being proclaimed and passed down to the next generation, the next generation will soon be lost and so forth on. We as Christians are called by the Gospel of Christ to proclaim the Good News, that Christ is risen, Alleluia!!! He is risen indeed!!!
